#### Planned actions for Proposed Industrial Action on Wednesday 5th July and Friday 7th July

As you will be aware, the National Education Union has called for its members to undertake further industrial action on Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> July and Friday 7<sup>th</sup> July. Following discussions with our staff and governing body, our arrangements for the Industrial Action days will largely be the same as for previous days when there has been industrial action, with the same procedural and risk assessment arrangements in place for both children and staff. What it will regrettably mean is that, once again, school will be partially open to some children and closed to others. Children who will be at home on these dates will be able to access their usual range of online learning resources.
