Dear Cragside Family,

I hope that you are all well and are looking forward to the Spring half term holiday. The brighter mornings are certainly giving a sense of Spring being in the air and it's lovely to see the snowdrops and daffodils pushing through the soil to welcome the beginning of this new season. I've attached to this newsletter a flier which we have received from Cramlington Town Council which gives information about a skateboarding activity being held at Alexandra Park during the half term break.

Tuesday 28th February - update of planned date for Industrial Action

I am sure you continue to be aware that, despite discussions between the Government and teaching unions there has been no change to the regional and national plans for the proposed industrial action due to take place on Tuesday 28th February. Thankfully, our staff who are eligible to strike have shared with me their planned intentions for this date, which is something they are not obliged to do. This means I am able to share with you and give you as much notice as possible as to what this means for us at Cragside. Currently, with the information that I have, school will be partially open on Tuesday 28th February for the following classes:

- Mrs Pemberton's class (RLP)
- Mrs Cant's class (2RC)
- Mrs Harper's class (3RH)
- Mrs Urwin-Clark's class (4UC)
- Miss Rennison's class (6ER)

Children who have an allocated social worker or an EHCP are also able to come into school, as part of our risk assessment for the day. Our breakfast club and after school club provision will also be available for those children whose classes will run as normal. If anything does change between now and then, I will let you know as soon as possible. If the industrial action is called off, even at the last minute, then we will be fully open for all children. However, based on the national tone currently, I feel this may be being overly optimistic. Again, this has been a difficult decision for all involved to make and we are all desperate for a resolution to be found at a national level.

It is important again to highlight that this planned industrial action is in relation to the National Education Union's dispute with the Government, and not related to any specific issue in our school. Whilst other schools may have different plans in place on these proposed dates, our plans are as a result of the number of staff who are members of professional associations which has fed into our individual risk assessment for this date.

February Half Term Reading Challenge

World Book Day
