The children will read Rapunzel by Bethan Woollvin. We will consider the ways in which illustrations can deepen and enrich the meaning of a text and enhance the reader experience. We will explore the story through a variety of teaching approaches including artwork, drama and role-play . We will write in role in order to explore and develop empathy for characters. Finally we will develop reader response by exploring interpretations of themes, plots and characters' actions and motivations through discussion and debate After this we will read the non fiction book, Great Women who changed History. The children will find out about the lives of a range of significant individuals by retrieving and interpreting information from the text and then using this to structure their own writing about a significant person in history.		Maths In Maths the children will be learning about fractions. They will identify whether something has or has not been split into equal parts; name the fraction 'one-half' in relation to a fraction of a length, shape or set of objects; name the fraction 'one-quarter' in relation to a fraction of a length, shape or set of objects; name the fraction 'one-third' in relation to a fraction of a length, shape or set of objects. Children will read and write the fraction notation 1/2, 1/3 and 1/4 and relate this to a fraction of a length, shape or set of objects. They will then find ½, 1/3 or 1/4 of a number. Children will find 2/4 and 3/4 of an object, shape, set of objects, length or quantity and will recognise the equivalence of 2/4 and ½. Encourage your child to spot equal and unequal groups in everyday life.		Science Our topic this half term is Plants. In this unit children will explore how seeds and bulbs grow into mature plants. They will investigate what plants need to grow and will find out and describe how plants need water, light and a suitable temperature to grow and stay healthy. Children will discover where seeds come from by investigating fruits and seeds in their local environment. They will carefully observe and sort seeds and will also recognise how some plants are able to grow from bulbs. They will plant a variety of seeds, describing how they grow. Children will have the opportunity to plant seeds and to observe growth. To develop their Working Scientifically skills, children will observe seeds and plants using simple equipment. They will ask simple questions about what plants need to grow and they will perform simple tests recognising that their questions can be answered in different ways.		
Information and Reminders Please could you make sure that your child has their reading planner in school every day. Handwriting and spellings go out on a Monday. The Reading Challenge rewards children for frequent reading at home. If they read 25 times they receive a bookmark and if they read 50 times they receive a pencil and if they read 75 times they receive a book. If they read 100 times they get an afternoon te at the end of term! Please sign your child's reading record every time you read with them to help them to gain their tallies.
