Dear Cragside Family,

Welcome back to a new year and a new school term. I hope that you had a joyful time over the holiday. On behalf of everyone in our school, I would like to take this opportunity to wish you all a very happy and healthy New Year. I would also like to say a huge thank you for the kind donations which you sent into school as part of our kindness advent. These were gratefully received by the Hope Centre who sent an appreciative letter to the children this week. During our Shining Stars worship this morning, we not only celebrated those children whose work and commitment to learning has been exemplary this week, but also announced our Spring term Year 6 Prefects and new Anti-Bullying Ambassadors. These children were given badges, which we would like them to wear each day, so that their leadership roles are recognised by other children who may need some help and support.

In addition, this week we have been delighted to welcome a number of new children into our Nursery setting, as part of our January intake and it has been wonderful to see these children explore the setting and become familiar with the routines and activities which take place within the setting.

As we begin a new year and a new term, I'd like to take this opportunity to remind you of a few things:

School Uniform

Please ensure that all school uniform is clearly labelled. We have an increasing amount of unnamed sweatshirts, hoodies and coats which we are unable to relocate with their rightful owners! Children should be wearing a white polo shirt, red sweatshirt or cardigan (with or without or school logo) and grey trousers or skirts. PE kit should be worn on PE days and must consist of a plain black joggers/leggings, a plain black sweatshirt or Cragside hoodie and a plain white tshirt. I aim to make our school uniform as affordable and accessible as possible for all families and children should not be coming into school in any branded items. The Hope Centre in Cramlington offers a range of preloved, sustainable uniform items for our school. Please can I also remind you that children are allowed to bring healthy snacks and water into school.

Attendance Matters – A message from Mrs Bilton

I thought it would be useful for me to share a few words from the Department for Education about the importance of good attendance for your child.

How does attendance affect outcomes for pupils?

Being in school is important to your child's achievement, wellbeing, and wider development. Evidence shows that the students with the highest attendance throughout their time in school gain the best GCSE and A Level results. Our research found that pupils who performed better both at the end of primary and secondary school missed fewer days than those who didn't perform as well.

The data also shows that, primary school children in Key Stage 2 who didn't achieve the expected standard in reading, writing and maths missed on average four more days per school year than those whose performance exceeded the expected standard.

Given the critical benefits of excellent attendance, I'm sure you will share my delight and pride in our high rate of attendance at Cragside. We are currently at 96.3%. This high rate of attendance puts us in the top 10-20% of schools nationally. This is such wonderful news, and shows that every Cragside family fully appreciates how important it is to be in school every day. Well done Cragside families.

Please can I also remind you that if you are unsure about whether your child is well enough to be in school, we would encourage you to consult the NHS guidance for parents for when to keep your

Parking in the local area

As most of you will be aware, there are parking restrictions within the local area which are in place for the safety of all children coming into and leaving school. Parking around school continues to pose a risk to our children. Last term, a near miss was reported to me, where a parent narrowly missed hitting a child as they were reversing away from school. Parking around school is also a problem for many of our local residents, who have reported to me that their drives have been blocked, preventing them from leaving their home. There are a number of identified parking areas which families could use to park at and then walk along the cycle paths into school.
