<u>English</u>

This half term we explore a range of high-quality texts which will promote imagination and discussions.

The children will predict how different stories will end and then retell them in their own words. They will focus on characters and will ask questions about them. They will link the characters' experiences to their own using drama and role-play. They will then decide which story they liked most and give reasons for their choice. The main stories we will read are:

- Man on the moon (fiction)
- The Gigantic Turnip (fiction)
- Snow White and the seven dart frogs (fiction)

Alongside this, the children will engage with daily phonics lessons to support sound recognition, blending, reading and writing.

Maths

In Maths this half term we will focus on the following units:

- ★ Unit 11: Multiplication and division
- ★ Unit 12: Fractions
- ★ Unit 13: Position and direction

Times table focus

Additionally, the children will continue to count in 5's up to 60 and solve one step multiplication/division problems with support.

All children are set 2's, 5's and 10's times tables via TimesTables Rockstars. This is for the children to practice more at home.

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PSHCE & Relationships

How are bodies amazing and what do we know about our own bodies?

This topic explores how to stay healthy, both physically and mentally. It explores ways to maintain well-being and prevent illness; how to develop a healthy, balanced lifestyle; and the consequences and effects of different habits and choices. It encourages the development of positive self-worth, what might affect or influence unhealthy ways of thinking, and how to overcome this.

Religious Education Who made the world?

In R.E. the children will be finding out more about who Christians believe made the world. We will actively retell the story of creation from Genesis 1:1-2.3. We will learn that 'Creation' is the beginning of the 'big story' of the Bible. We will explore what the story tells Christians about God, Creation and the world. We will learn what Christians do to say thank you to God for the Creation and think, talk and ask questions about living in an amazing world.

Geography

<u>Is the weather the same around the world?</u> For our topic this half term, we will be exploring different weather around the world.

We will look closely at the location of hot and cold climates in relation to the equator and map the cold, temperate, warm and tropical zones. Alongside this, we will think about the animals that live in different climates and understand how they survive in these places. We will use key vocabulary such as temperature, climate, Northern hemisphere, Southern hemisphere and habitats.

Art

Sculpture

This half-term we will focus on creating sculptures using clay. We will look at a range of sculptors both local and from other parts of the country/world. The artist we will focus on is Antony Gormley. We will look at the different techniques used, become familiar with the equipment and how to handle it safely. We will use our prior knowledge of designing to support the making of our sculptures. At the end of our unit, we will host an "art gallery" in our classroom for our peers to look at our sculptures and create evaluations.
