School attendance is vital because it directly links to academic attainment; near-perfect attendance makes pupils significantly more likely to achieve strong results in core subjects like English and maths. Beyond academic attainment, school provides essential opportunities for social and emotional development. Regular attendance is key to developing social skills, building positive relationships, and preparing pupils for adulthood.

Whole School Attendance

I am delighted that we have maintained our strong start to whole school attendance. At 97%, we are in the top 10-20% of schools nationally. As always, I'm really keen to maintain this position, and improve it if possible.
