Dear Cragside Family,

As always, we have had enjoyed a very busy two weeks in school, with a whole range of different learning experiences for our children, which have ranged from skipping and table tennis workshops and our wonderful star gazing, which was hosted by our Space Club attendees and Kielder Observatory. A very big thank you to all of the children who were involved running workshops and experiments during this event and for encouraging a love of Space in other children. It was a shame that the clouds affected what we are able to view from the telescope, but it was great that there was a short time that children could view Jupiter when there was a small break in the clouds. Thank you to all of you who attended this free event – the feedback from children and families was really positive. I was also delighted to see so many of our Reception children's families at this morning's Reception Curriculum morning. The session which Mrs Clarke led, felt so purposeful in sharing with you how we teach our children to decode, spell and enjoy reading a story. Thank you to those of you who were able to join this session – I know that the children love having their grown-ups in school and showing off their learning.

A note about parental messaging groups

I would like to take a moment to address the growing impact that parental messaging groups are beginning to have within our school community, particularly causing upset and distress to some individual families. Staff and I often see screenshots, chats or hear from families that children, incidents and, on a small number of occasions, school staff, have been referred to inaccurately or that situations shared on a WhatsApp group have been misrepresented and miscommunicated and have subsequently been shared or interpreted as fact. Increasingly, teaching staff are spending valuable time responding to issues arising from adults messaging, which inevitably detracts from the time available for teaching and learning. Myself and my staff team are deeply invested in ensuring the very best for every child and will always contact families directly if there is a concern regarding behaviour, wellbeing or to follow up on a situation if one has arisen during the school day. As you know, we are an incredibly open and approachable school, and aim to manage any concerns relating to individual children professionally and fairly. If there is an incident or we have a concern about a child, we are in direct contact with families to discuss these. Equally, if you have any concerns, please contact school staff directly to share these. Please be mindful that information shared on these messaging sites is not always factually accurate.

Attendance Matters – An update from Mrs Bilton

Why School Attendance Matters (taken from a Department for Education blog). Every day at school counts. The evidence is clear - even a few days of missed school can have a significant impact on a child's education and future prospects.

How attendance affects attainment-

Recent research by the Department for Education shows just how closely attendance and attainment are linked. At primary school, children who attend school nearly every day in Year 6 (95-100% attendance) are 30% more likely to reach the expected standard in reading, writing and maths compared to similar pupils who attend 90-95% of the time.

This is why we're always working to improve attendance at Cragside.
